St Alban

Hello Friends!

Last Monday, June 22 was St Albans Day. We are well aware of the beautiful little church in our parish named for St Alban -located in Riverside Albert. But, let me tell you about the man behind the name...

Alban, along with his fellow saints Julius and Aaron, were the first three martyrs from Roman Britain –martyred by then Emperor Severus in 209 AD. Alban was a man of great character –even as a Roman soldier. It is evident that Alban was open to the way of Jesus before Alban had fully realized who Jesus was. Also, Alban was watching the barbaric acts of the emperor, under whom he served. Thus, Alban provided shelter for a priest who was fleeing from the persecution under Severus. When he hosted the priest, Alban observed his piety and faithful devotion to God in his daily prayers. Alban and the priest began to discuss faith together. Soon, the priest baptized Alban.

Meanwhile, Emperor Severus continued to persecute Christians (for their refusal to worship him as god). Hearing of Alban’s “disloyalty,” he found out the Priest’s location and sent soldiers to arrest him. Alban, seeing the formidable posse approaching, took the priest’s cloak and put it on himself. When the soldiers arrived, Alban stepped forward claiming his name to be “Amphibulus” - (the name of the Priest’s cloak). As Alban put on the cloak, he willingly assumed the priest’s identity. As a result, Alban was taken before the magistrate. Furious about the deception, the officials ordered that Alban be given the punishment due to the priest - if he had indeed become a Christian. Alban declared: "I worship and adore the true and living God who created all things." As a result of his unswerving faithfulness to God, Alban, was taken outside the town and martyred.

Friends, in this story, we notice several exchanges. An exchange of name: Alban to Amphibulus; an exchange of clothing: soldier to priest; and a spiritual exchange: pagan to believer.

Jesus, at the Cross offers an exchange of our sin for His righteousness. He wants you and I to take his cloak and give him ours as tattered as it is. I encourage you all, along with me to take Jesus’ “cloak” upon you as we follow Him each day.

Today's Devotion

Road Closed, Spirit-Led



After a lengthy journey, my wife and I finally neared our street, but a large road closed to thru traffic sign blocked our path. I felt the urge to drive around it because home was just ahead, and I didn’t like being rerouted. But then I saw why the road was closed: A downed power line lay across the road. Had I ignored the warning, I could have driven into danger.

In Acts 16:6-10, Paul and his companions were eager to preach the gospel in the province of Asia, but the Holy Spirit closed that door. Detours aren’t always rejection, however. They can be divine redirections. Like the roadblock on our street, God rerouted Paul from entering the province of Bithynia. It must

have been frustrating to be blocked, especially while Paul was striving to do his best. But then he received a vision in which a man said, “Come over to Macedonia and help us” (v. 9). God said “no” to something good because He was preparing them for something else—taking the gospel to the people of another continent (v. 10).

Rather than seeing “no” as punishment and rejection, we can see it as His Spirit-led redirection. His detours are often pathways to divine appointments. Let’s not simply trust His direction when the roads are open; let’s follow when He closes them too.
